Purpose	

Pursuant to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Internal Revenue Code (IRC) 6050S and 6051 the university is required to solicit from students whose SSNs/TINs may be missing or incorrect. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in civil penalties, assessed by the IRS. The purpose of providing SSN/TIN is for the issuance of the Form 1098-T, Tuition Payments Statement.
