
Dean Gregory Maddox Honored by Congress



Dean Gregory Maddox was honored for his 31 years of dedicated service to Texas Southern University on November 9, 2019.

Dean Maddox was honored for his service as History Professor, Dean of the Graduate School, Director of International Programs, and Accreditation Liaison to the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, among others. He was presented with a Certificate of Recognition from the United States Congress by Sheila Jackson Lee.

Dr. Roger Hart Wins Fulbright Scholar Award

Dr. Roger Hart received a prestigious U.S. Fulbright Scholar award. He will be at Seoul National University in South Korea from Jan 2021- October 2021. The Fulbright Scholarship Board writes, the "grant is a reflection of [his] leadership and contributions to society."



The Fulbright Program is the U.S. government's "flagship international educational exchange program." Dr. Hart is working on a project entitled Quantum States, Quantum Entanglements, which will study the intertwined development of science and the State.

The Fulbright U.S. Scholar award is one of the most prestigious awards available to scholars in the humanities and Dr. Hart plans to use the award to strengthen TSU's relationship with universities in East Asia, including China, South Korea and Japan.

Dr. Pitre's book, Born to Serve: A History of Texas Southern University published in 2018 with University of Oklahoma Press won the 2019 Summerlee Foundation book Prize and the Ottis Locke Award for the best book on East Texas History 2019

Dr. Pitre and her research were featured in a film, "Citizens at Last: the fight for women's vote in Texas," screened at the Texas State Historical Association annual meeting on Friday, February 28, 2020. Oral history video of Dr. Merline Pitre by the History

Makers Organization is part of the Library of Congress Civil Rights History Project. In summer 2019, Dr. Pitre became a Fellow of the Central Texas Historical Association.

Dr. Nupur Chaudhuri Wins Award



Dr. Chaudhuri is co-winner of the Rachel Fuchs Memorial Award for Excellence in Mentorship and Service to Women/ LGBTQ in the History Profession from Coordinating Council for Women in History.

Dr. Chaudhuri has been elected to serve as Chair of the Women's Council of the Organization of American Historians (OAH). This is one of the top organizations in the discipline. Since May of 2020 she was elected to serve as a member of the Program Committee of

the Western Association Women Historians.

Dr. Trushna Parekh Awarded AAG Grant



Dr. Trushna Parekh was awarded a \$25,000 "Bridging the Digital COVID-19 Divide" grant from the American Association of Geographers (AAG). 100% of funds were distributed to Geography students at TSU in Fall 2020.

In 2020, Dr. Parekh was invited to serve on the Editorial Board of the Annals of the American Association of Geographers, the flagship journal of the discipline.


The Department of History, Geography, and General Studies has held several exciting events during the last two years. A Panel Discussion was held virtually on March 25, 2021 on the 1619 Project.



This panel discussion format allowed for student engagement and discussion on the 1619 project and its global, historical and contemporary connections.


On February 10, 2021, a Film Screening of "I Am Not Your Negro" was held virtually, a retrospective look at racial politics





History Department Alumni were invited to serve as panelists at our Career Paths in History event on February 18, 2020. Dr. Kelvin White, Associate Dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Information Studies at the University of Oklahoma and Yvonne Frear, Department Chair of Behavioral and Social Sciences at San Jacinto College were our invited panelists. Dr. Karen Kossie-Chernyshev served as moderator.



Ms. Kimberly Milton, Adjunct Professor of History gave a lecture on the "History of Hip Hop" as part of our Lunchtime Lecture Series on January 23, 2020. The purpose of the presentation was to discuss the origins of rap, what was it like in the beginning, how it started and how rap has evolved and lasted so long. Ms. Milton also spoke about the differences between East Coast and West Coast

Rap, and how they both have been influential even until today.



Dr. Merline Pitre gave the first lecture in our departmental lunchtime lecture series on November 20, 2019, with a discussion on her award winning book Born to Serve: A History of Texas Southern University. Dr. Pitre discussed the history and development of Texas Southern University through each administration and framed her discussion within the history of education and integration in the United States.

A viewing of the film *Red Soul* was sponsored by the Department on November 8, 2019. The film examined different memories and nostalgia felt about Joseph Stalin's rule in Communist Russia. The award-winning documentary filmmaker, Jessica Gorter, was on hand to answer questions after the viewing. This screening marks the third annual collaboration between the History Department and the Russian Cultural Center 'Our Texas' organized by Dr. Karen Kossie-Chernyshev.



The department also cosponsored the Dia de los Muertos event on October 31, 2019. The event, coordinated by Dr. Jesus Esparza, included an ofrenda (altar) with photos of loved ones, skull painting, and pan dulce. The event was sponsored in conjunction with the Foreign language program, the Hispanic Student Association, Omega Delta Phi,



and the Office of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion.



University of Louisiana @ Monroe (NLU) and didn't think about becoming a teacher until after I substituted at several of the local middle schools in my community. I've always had a passion for History, and when my students ask me, "Why is History important for us to learn" I always tell them that knowing one's past as well as others, where they came from, and their heritage are still good things to know. If one knows themselves and the mistakes their ancestors have made, then hopefully, they will try to avoid doing the same. After a brief visit to Houston to see my brother, I decided that Houston would be the ideal place for me to live. I am a member of New Faith Missionary Baptist Church. My faith has always been a deeply rooted part of my life. I'm currently a member of New Faith Missionary Baptist Church in Houston. I've been teaching History for over 20 years, and now I'm a 7th grade Texas History teacher at Navarro Middle school. My hobbies include walking, hot yoga, and aerobics.
